Students will create a fictional protest about a topic important to African American history. You will create a protest, counter protest, and cover the event. This assignment is meant to be creative and develop students' analytical, research, and communication skills. All projects are expected to incorporate diverse perspectives. All topics and ideas must be approved by me first. Students will receive feedback on drafts and must revise their work before submitting the final copy of their protest project.

The Protest Project is worth 1,000 total points and 60% (30% for drafts and 30% for the final project) of your total final grade.
